3. Tremaine Medal: Call for Nominations / La Médaille Marie Tremaine: Candidatures

The Marie Tremaine Medal is awarded by the BSC/SbC for outstanding service to Canadian bibliography and for distinguished publication in either English or French in that field. The medal may be awarded in 1999, preferably to a member of the Society and/or a Canadian citizen. Members of the Council of the Society are not eligible for the award while they are in office. Previous winners of the Tremaine Medal are: Marie Tremaine, 1970; John Hare and Jean-Pierre Wallot, 1973; Bruce Braden Peel, 1975; William F.Morely, 1977; Reginald Eyre Watters, 1979; Olga Bernice Bishop, 1981; Alan F.J. Artibise, 1983; Douglas Grant Lochead, 1985; Agnes Cecilia O'Dea, 1987; Sandra Alston, 1988; Gloria Strathern, 1989, 1989; Claude Galarneau, 1990; Patricia Fleming, 1992; Joan Winearls, 1993; Paul Aubin, 1994; Ernie Ingles, 1996. The Tremaine Medal Committee now invites nominations for this award. Each nomination must be supported by a biographical note, a list of principal publications, and other relevant information, and sent by 31 January, 1999 to: Chair, Tremaine Medal Committee, c/o Apollonia Steele, Special Collections, University of Calgary Library, 2500 University Drive N.W. 4. Amtmann and Tremaine Fellowships

The Bernard Amtmann Fellowship is offered in memory of Bernard Amtmann (1907-1979), the noted bookseller and specialist in Canadiana. The Fellowship is offered every three years and thereafter to support the work of a scholar in one of Mr. Amtmann's principal areas of interest: Canadiana, book collecting, bookselling, and bibliography. Special Consideration will be given to applications from those working on some aspect of the book trade. The Fellowship, which is in the amount of \$1,500.00 is open to non-Canadians and to those who not members of the Bibliographical Society of Canada.

The Tremaine Fellowship is offered in memory and through the generosity of Marie Tremaine (1902-84), the doyenne of Canadian bibliographers. The Fellowship was instituted in 1987 and is offered annually to support the work of a scholar engaged in some area of bibliographical research, including textual studies and publishing history, and with a particular emphasis on Canada. The Fellowship, which is in the amount of \$1,000.00, is open only to members of the Bibliographical Society of Canada.

Both fellowships will be awarded only in support of specific research projects, involving discrete areas of research. Projects which are part of some larger undertaking will not be considered unless they can be completed on their own and can lead to findings which are reportable or publishable in themselves. The funds available are for out-of-pocket expenses such as travel fares and subsistence, and technical services or supplies, and may not be used for salaries or stipends.

Applications should be made on the form provided in this issue of the *Bulletin* and must be accompanied by a detailed budget proposal, a full *curriculum vitae*, and two sealed letters of reference. They should be mailed to The Chair, Fellowships Committee, Bibliographical Society of Canada, P.O. Box 575, Postal Station P, Toronto, ON M5S 2T1, and must be postmarked no later than 28 February, 1999.

6. Summary of the BSC Recommendations on the Future Role of the National Library of Canada.

This list of recommendations is based upon the submission made on behalf of the Bibliographical Society of Canada by Anne Yandle, Peter F. McNally, and Eric Swanick to the Study being conducted by Professor John English on the National Library and the National Archives of Canada. The document was submitted in September 1998.

Mandate:

- 1. That the Library's mandate be strengthened in the areas of research and research support.
- 2. That in addition to other duties and in conjunction with other institutions, the Library become a research centre for Canadian studies.
- 3. That the Library develop a centre for the study of the book in Canada.
- 4. That the Library become a funding agency for a) bibliographical research, b) the history of the book, c) and the compilation of scholarly bibliographies.
- 5. That the Library resume the sale and distribution, on a cost recovery basis, Canadian theses either on its own or in co-operation with some other Canadian organization.
- 6. That the Library develop foreign language collections as a backup resource for other Canadian libraries.

Collections and Acquisitions

- 7. That the Library accelerate its collecting of literary, historical, and other non-governmental papers and records.
- 8. That the Library collect Canadian publications in electronic formats, as exhaustively as it does other publications in paper formats.

Access

- 9. That the Library be strengthened so that it may serve as a role model to other libraries and the public on how libraries can adapt to the demands of the emerging electronic information environment.
- 10. That the library maintain and extend its bibliographical control of Canadian publications in paper, microform, and electronic formats and make the bibliographic data readily available to individuals and other libraries.
- 11. That the Library be provided with the resources necessary to ensure that Canadian library cataloguing remain in Canada.
- 12. That the Library's policy towards exhibitions and programmes include the following: sending travelling exhibitions across the country, encouraging other libraries to develop exhibitions, funding library exhibitions, and providing courses on exhibitions and programming.

Preservation

- 13. That the Library monitor closely the competing claims of electronic, microform, and paper based formats for the preservation of the artifacts of information and knowledge.
- 14. That the Library revive its national preservation programme.

Information Management Issues

15. That the Library assist federal and provincial governments in communicating with citizens, through exhaustively collecting and bibliographically controlling government publications.

Organizational Structure

- 16. That the National Library and the National Archives be encouraged to co-operate with one another as much as possible, while remaining separate institutions.
- 17. That the Library's funding be increased so that it can properly fulfill its mandate.

Leadership

- 18. That a National Librarian with energy, and ability be appointed to raise the profile of the Library, give it a renewed sense of direction, and obtain the resources necessary to fulfill its mandate.
- 19. That the Library's key role, in developing and implementing national cultural and information policies and activities, be publicly promoted and acknowledged.

7. Notice of Next General Meeting.

The next general meeting of the Bibliographical Society of Canada will take place during the Congress of Social Sciences and Humanities being held at Université de Sherbrooke and Bishop's University (Sherbrooke/Lennoxville, Quebec) from June 10 to 12, 1999.

8. Call For Papers

The Bibliographical Society of Canada (<u>www.library.utoronto.ca/~bsc</u>) invites proposals for papers on various aspects of bibliography and the history of the book, particularly as they relate to Canada, to be delivered at the Annual Conference to be held in Sherbrooke/Lennoxville, QC from June 10-12, 1999.

It is expected that all papers will be based upon original research, and will not have been previously published.

Overviews and case studies will be considered as will proposals on related topics. Abstracts of no more than 100 words should accompany proposals.

The Bibliographical Society of Canada will hold its 1999 conference in Sherbrooke/Lennoxville, QC, in conjunction with Le groupe de recherche sur l'edition littéraire au Quebec and with L'association Québecoise pour l'étude de l'imprimé. Presentations will be considered for publication in the Society's *Papers/Cahiers*.

The BSC/SbC Annual General Meeting was held in Vancouver, British Columbia, at the downtown campus of Simon Fraser University (Harbour Centre) on Thursday July 16, 1998. History of the Book in Canada / Histoire de l'imprimé au Canada

Le projet progresse à la vitesse de l'intérêt et du bénévolat de toutes et de tous. Après la conférence de lancement du projet à Ottawa en mai 1997 qui a donné lieu à un état de la recherche sur l'histoire de l'imprimé dans les régions du Canada (voir le site internet http://www.library.mcgill.ca/hbic/pour les textes et pour d'autres renseignements) et après la journée d'échanges à l'occasion du congrès de SHARP à Vancouver en juillet dernier, notre Projet dispose maintenant d'un cadre conceptuel qui ressemble, pour l'essentiel, à celui qui avait été proposé et bonifié à Ottawa. Ce cadre conceptuel servira de document de base pour les co-Directeurs de chacun des trois volumes du projet qui sauront l'adapter tout en assurant une nécessaire continuité de problématique dans les trois volumes.

L'équipe des trois volumes comprend Patricia Fleming et Gilles Gallichan (volume I: 1751-1840), Fiona Black et Yvan Lamonde (II:1840-1914), Carole Gerson et Jacques Michon (III: 1914-c. 1970). Bertrum MacDonald s'est joint à l'équipe à titre de responsable de l'équipe bibliographique, entre autres responsabilités. Nous remercions Jean-Pierre Wallot, qui avait accepté de co-diriger le volume I mais qui a dû, pour des raisons personnelles, alléger sa contribution au Projet. Les Presses de l'Université de Toronto et les Editions Fides ont accepté de publier les éditions de langue anglaise et française du Projet. L'équipe éditoriale travaille actuellement à la préparation d'une importante demande de subvention.

GIS for Book History - Call for Collaborations

The concept and rationale for using geographic information systems (GIS) technology for aspects of book history are presented in Fiona A. Black and Bertrum H. MacDonald and J. Malcolm W. Black "Geographic Information Systems: A New Research Method for Book History." Book History 1 (1998): 11-31. Black and MacDonald seek collaborators who have, or are creating, databases related to print culture. To be applicable in a GIS the database must contain at least one field which relates to "spatial data" (e.g.) historic locations of bookshops, newspaper agents, readers, regional information regarding literacy, etc.) The proposed international project has three goals: to explore the methodology through a variety of applications concerning different aspects of book history, to aid comparative studies especially in relation to the various national histories of the book now underway, and to provide the foundation for an electronic atlas of book history.

"Toronto in Print: A Celebration of 200 Years of the Printing Press in Toronto, 1798-1998"

To celebrate the arrival of printing press in Toronto in September 1798, the Thomas Fisher Rare Book Library presented an exhibition entitled *Toronto in Print: A Celebration of 200 Years of the Printing Press in Toronto, 1798-1998* from 3 August to 2 October 1998.
