1. CREATION OF THE NEW WATTERS-MORLEY PRIZE/NOUVELLE PRIX WATTERS-MORELY

The Bibliographical Society of Canada / La Société bibliographique du Canada is pleased to announce the establishment of a new prize: the Watters-Morely Prize. The prize has been created jointly by William Morley and Beth Morley (formerly Mrs. Reginald Watters). In order to offer the prize, the Morleys have established an endowment of \$10,000. The prize will take the form of a cash gift to be given to the recipient of the Tremaine Medal.

The new prize will honour William Morely (Tremaine Medal Winner 1977) and the late Reginald Eyre Watters (Tremaine Medal Winner 1979) both recipients of the prestigious medal. On behalf of all members of the Society, we would like to thank the Morleys for the creation of the endowment and the prize.

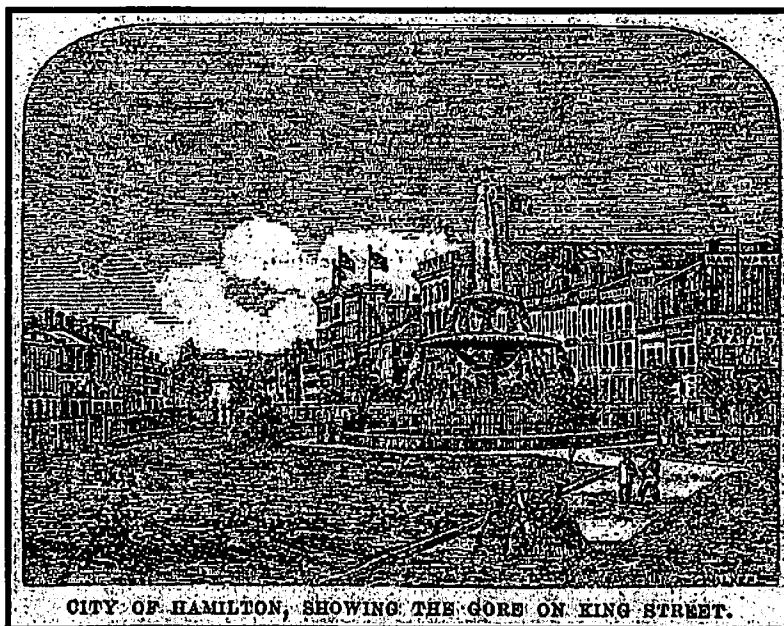

Ernie is currently Associate Vice-President Academic (Learning Services) and Chief Librarian at the University of Alberta. Ernie's leadership and commitment to the library profession are recognized and known through the library community, provincially and nationally. He has been an active player within the Canadian library and information technology communities having served on numerous associations and organizations. A

key contribution to the Canadian library community was his founding of the Northern Exposure to Leadership Institute, now acclaimed worldwide as a landmark contribution to librarianship and professional development.

Ernie has always been supportive and instrumental in the career development of library school students at the University of Alberta. In addition to providing professional library experience for students working as research assistants and sponsoring the annual SLIS social, the year 2000 saw the development and implementation of the Academic Library Internship Program - now recognized as a best practice in North America. Presently Ernie is spearheading the 8Rs project, a

comprehensive study of the current human resources climate in Canadian libraries. As the LISAA Honorary Alumni Award recipient Ernie will have his name engraved on a plaque at SLIS, receive a lifetime LISAA membership, and have a rare book dedicated in his honour in the Bruce Peel Special Collections, University of Alberta Library.

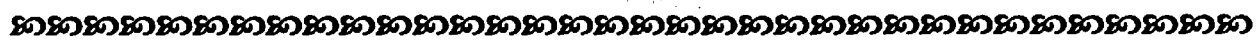

9. HISTORY OF THE BOOK IN CANADA/HISTOIRE DU LIVRE ET DE L'IMPRIMÉ AU CANADA (HBiC/HLIC)

HBiC/HLIC is in the midst of a phase of intensive production for its volumes and databases. The English edition of Volume I was delivered to University of Toronto Press in early November, with the French edition scheduled to be sent to Les Presses de l'Université de Montréal on 1 December 2003. Both editions will be published simultaneously in September 2004. Volume editors Patricia Fleming and Gilles Gallichan were grateful for the assistance of the many colleagues across Canada who brought the volume to fruition, and helped the project achieve one of its major milestones. Work continues apace on the other volumes. Volume II held its author conference at the University of Regina in mid-August and, although the power blackout in Toronto curtailed the travel of a number of authors, close to 20 attended the meetings. Co-editors Yvan Lamonde and Fiona Black were pleased with the feedback they obtained, and continue to collaborate with authors as they ready the manuscript for peer review in the early months of 2004. As of November 2003, many Volume III texts had been delivered to co-editors Carole Gerson and Jacques Michon. The texts are undergoing preliminary readings and commentary by the editorial team in preparation for the Volume III author conference, to be held at Longueuil in June 2004.

HBiC/HLIC marked another major milestone in June 2003 with the launch of three of the project's book history databases. The Bibliography of the History of the Book in Canada/Bibliographie sur l'histoire du livre et de l'imprimé au Canada (B-HBiC/B-HLIC), Catalogues canadiens relatifs à l'imprimé/Canadian Book Catalogues (CCRI/CBC), and Manuels scolaires au Canada/Canadian Textbooks (MSC/CT) can be accessed via the project's Web site at www.hbic.library.utoronto.ca (follow the Database links). The databases have been well received, and Bertrum H. MacDonald, Editor of Electronic Resources, notes that new records are being added on an ongoing basis. The database teams continue their work on two other electronic resources: the Canadian Book Trade and Library Index/Index canadien des métiers du livre et des bibliothèques (CBTLI/ICMLB) and Imprimés canadiens avant 1840/Canadian Imprints to 1840 (IC/CI).

Also in June, senior project members participated in a special program for the Rare Books and Manuscripts Section at the American Library Association conference in Toronto. Joined by a History of the Book in America editor, Robert A. Gross, the team presented an overview of the project, a panel discussion that examined HBiC/HLIC in its international context, a slide presentation on the iconography of the book in Canada, and a demonstration of the project's electronic resources. With some 100 people in attendance, the session provided an excellent means of informing librarians from across North America about the project. Staff members were again on hand at this year's Word on the Street to distribute flyers and bookmarks to the public. HBiC/HLIC will participate in other national and international events in the coming year.

Colloque sur l'état des collections des imprimés anciens au Québec

Les différentes bibliothèques québécoises regorgent, comme vous le savez, d'une multitude de livres imprimés aux XV^e, XVI^e et XVII^e siècles. Les institutions universitaires, religieuses, culturelles et même politiques, comme la Bibliothèque de l'Assemblée nationale, conservent quantité d'ouvrages qui pourraient être utiles à nos recherches et à celles de nos étudiants des cycles supérieurs. Malheureusement, ces richesses ne sont guère connues, et encore moins exploitées. Ce constat a mené un groupe de chercheurs à vouloir dresser, en collaboration avec la Bibliothèque nationale du Québec, un inventaire des imprimés des XV^e, XVI^e et XVII^e siècles présents en sol québécois.
