Annual Meeting 1977

The Society will have two speakers at its Annual Meeting on June 9th in Montreal. M. Maurice Lemire, Directeur, <u>Dictionnaire des oeuvres littéraires du Québec</u>, will speak about this project and other bibliographical work being done in the field of Quebec literature. The meeting will also be addressed by Mr. William Morley, recipient of this year's Tremaine Medal, who has chosen as his topic "Confessions of an opus eater".

Tremaine Medal for 1977

Mr. William F. E. Morley, Curator of Special Collections at the Douglas Library, Queen's University, was the unanimous choice for this year's Tremaine Medal. Mr. Morley is the author of many articles and monographs both historical and bibliographical. He is the editor of the important series Canadian Local Histories to 1950, of which volumes for the Atlantic Provinces and Quebec have appeared. His bibliographical study of Major John Richardson was the Society's special publication in 1973. The Medal will be presented to Mr. Morley at the Annual Meeting in June.

Honorary Member

Dr. Jaroslav B. Rudnyćkyj is to be made an Honorary Member of the Society at the Annual Meeting in June. Dr. Rudnyćkyj is the former Head of the Department of Slavic Studies at the University of Manitoba and a distinguished bibliographer in the field of Ukrainian Canadiana. He served on the Council of the Society between 1969 and 1972.

Rare Books Conference

The Rare Books and Manuscripts Preconference of the Association of College and Research Libraries will be held this year in Toronto from the 14th to the 17th of June, the first time the conference has been held outside the United States. The general theme is "Book Selling and Book Buying: Aspects of Nineteenth Century British and North American Book Trades", with speakers from Canada, United States and Britain. The fee for registration and conference meals is \$95 for ALA members, \$105 for non-members. Registration is limited. Metropolitan Toronto Library

The Metropolitan Toronto Library is moving this summer from College and St. George Streets to its new building at 789 Yonge Street, Toronto, M6G 1W1 (one block north of Bloor Street). All departments will be closed for approximately six weeks during the move. The new building will be officially opened on September 15th. Any one planning to use the Library during July or August should write for exact dates of closing and opening.

Communique: Canadian Studies

Communique: Canadian Studies is a bibliographic publication devoted to encouraging the wider use of Canadian materials in classrooms. Past issues have covered Native Studies, Women, Labour Studies, British Columbia, Fine Arts, Military History, Museum Resources, Multiculturalism, Atlantic Canada, and Urban Studies. Issues scheduled for the remainder of 1977 include Folk Culture, Film Studies, and Western Canada.

The issues on Museums, Multiculturalism, and Atlantic Canada are still available for \$2.00 per issue, including postage and handling; the Urban Studies issue is priced at \$3.00. All earlier issues are now out of print. The Canadian Newspaper Index

This new publication will provide a subject and name index to the Canadian news and events reported in five major newspapers: Montreal Star, Toronto Globe and Mail, Toronto Star, Vancouver Sun, and Winnipeg Free Press. Topics covered will include national, provincial and local news; international news of Canadian significance; book, film, music, theatre and art reviews; significant editorials and letters; and obituaries. It is to be published monthly approximately thirty days from month end, with an annual cumulation. The first issue announced for April 1977 will cover January to March 1977. Subscription rates are \$195 for 12 monthly issues, \$150 for the cumulative annual index (clothbound), \$325 for 12 monthly issues with annual cumulation. Laurentiana parus avant 1821

The Bibliothèque nationale du Québec (1700 rue Saint-Denis, Montréal, Québec, H2X 3K6) has recently published an important bibliography of its holdings in the field of early Laurentiana. Items are described in detail with supplementary information about the binding and provenance of BNQ copies. The work is extensively indexed including such special approaches as illustrations, maps and plans, printers, and place and date of publication. A copy is available for review in the Papers/Cahiers below.

Work in Progress

Two projects currently under way which may provide interesting historical parallels:

Mr. John A. Wiseman (Associate Librarian, Thomas J. Bata Library, Trent University, Peterborough, Ontario) is researching "The Common Reader in Nineteenth-Century Ontario", including the history of popular reading, the spread of the reading habit, and the dissemination of reading matter.

Professor Elizabeth Waterston (Department of English, University of Guelph) and Mr. Bernard Katz (University of Guelph Library) are working on an analytical and statistical study of best selling books in Canada during the period 1965 to 1975 to determine what features of subject (in non-fiction) or character, plot and scene (in fiction) distinguish popular reading material. From this study they hope to draw conclusions "about Canadian tastes and Canadian values based on literary preferences as demonstrated by book purchase".

International Standard Serial Numbers

The National Library of Canada has just issued a leaflet describing the application and use of the ISSN for serial publications in Canada. In 1973 the National Library was designated the national centre for Canada for the International Serials Data System, and ISDS Canada was created to number all serials published in Canada and to forward bibliographic data to the central data base in Paris. ISDS publishes a bimonthly bulletin, available on subscription from its headquarters at 20 rue Bachaumont, 75002 Paris, France, which provides information about serials registered throughout the ISDS network. John Lovell & Son, Limited, Montreal

The Secretary-Treasurer recently sent a copy of the Lovell facsimile to John Lovell & Son, Printers and Publishers, of Montreal. The President, Mr. Robert M. Lovell, replied that he was delighted to receive it and that he was unaware that his great grandfather had produced the original type specimen book. Members of the Society who will be in Montreal for the Annual Meeting may be interested to know that the present day firm of John Lovell & Son is still located at 423 St. Nicholas Street, site of the printing office of Lovell & Gibson in 1846.

Goldie Diary

In reply to an inquiry about the diary of John Goldie which was distributed to members with the last <u>Bulletin</u>, Mrs. Theresa Goldie Falkner writes that it was published at her expense for Canada's Centennial and designed and printed by the University of Toronto Press. Mrs. Falkner is the ninth of ten children of David Goldie, who was the youngest child of the botanist. Her grandfather died before she was born. Though in her late eighties, Mrs. Falkner still takes a lively interest in the life of Toronto.

Committee on Bibliographical Services for Canada/Comité des services bibliographiques pour le Canada

Mr. William Morley, the Society's representative on the Committee, reports on recent activities:

The Committee on Bibliographical Services for Canada met for the third time at the National Library of Canada, November 22-23, 1976. The bulk of this meeting was taken up with a report on the Canadian abstracting and indexing services survey, which had been distributed earlier in the year. On the basis of the survey report it was determined to convene a workshop with representatives of these services, to be invited by the National Librarian. The dates for the workshop were established as the 7th and 8th March, 1977, and this will be followed by a meeting of the Committee members on March 9th. The National Library of Canada has provided the necessary rooms and facilities for the meetings. In preparation for the workshop, an information directory on the eighteen abstracting and indexing services has been prepared for distribution to all the workshop participants.

In addition, at the third meeting of the Committee, members considered a series of reports, prepared in-Committee, dealing with Canadian and foreign financing of bibliographical activity, the evaluation of bibliographical projects, bibliographical standards in Canada and bibliographical education or training. These reports were prepared in accordance with the Committee's research programme, which is designed to provide a firm basis for the Committee's eventual activity.

On February 3rd, 1977, the National Library issued a news release that a permanent secretariat for the Committee had been established. Mr. Peter Greig, a member of the Society, has been named Secretary to the Committee on a full-time basis and put in charge of the secretariat.
